

COVID-19: Retail To-Go

Pursuant to Executive Order GA-16, issued on Friday, April 17, 2020, by Governor Greg Abbott, and effective at 12:01 a.m. on Friday, April 24, 2020, some retail businesses classified as "non-essential" in the original Stay-at-Home order will be able to provide "to-go" services with some restrictions.

REMEMBER TO STAY HOME WHEN YOU ARE SICK, EXCEPT TO GET MEDICAL CARE

Any "non-essential" business that will re-open using this "retail-to-go" system must follow these guidelines from the Texas Department of State Health Services for the safety of employees and customers:

• CUSTOMERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED INSIDE THE STORE

- Customers may buy items from a retail store for pick-up, delivery by mail, or delivery to doorstep.
- All payments should be done over the phone or internet. If not possible, contact should be minimized.
- Purchased items should be delivered to the customer's trunk or backseat to minimize contact.
- Any items delivered to a house should be delivered to the front door. Delivery personnel are not allowed to enter a residence.

No changes were made to how essential business operate. Executive Order GA-16 does not apply to "essential" businesses that have been able to operate during the Stay-at-Home order.
